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Mental Health Authority Undergoes Name Change

The Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority (DWMHA) is changing its name to the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN) in an effort to more accurately reflect the direction of the organization, which is taking a more holistic approach to the care it provides to more than 75,000 children and adults it serves in Wayne County.

The DWMHA Board of Directors approved the name change June 19, 2019. This change was necessary to reflect the full array of services and supports offered by the organization. Our goal is to become a national leader that improves the overall behavioral and physical health of the people in our community.

“We are moving more toward the intersection of behavioral and physical health to provide a fully integrated system of care to the people we serve and we wanted our name to reflect the change as well,” said President and CEO Willie Brooks.

What does this name change mean for the people we serve?
